RoadWork Updates

A guard rail water break was installed on Pine Ridge to divert water away from Birch Trail and into an existing culvert. An additional guard rail water break was installed on Birch Trail to divert water back into the ditch along the right side of the road. Water in this area was exiting the existing ditch and exposing a water line during heavy rain. Additionally, the deep ditch at the corner of Birch Trail and South Rhododendron was extended to allow the large amount of water exiting Burch Trail a larger deeper area to collect and run off.

The Water Company is pleased to report there have been no new leaks since the large leak in February. The system has been stable. Bear Activity in the Valley

A note from the NC Wildlife Commission: North Carolina's human population is increasing and many new homes are built in occupied bear range each year. Black bears are an important part of North Carolina's fauna, and it is ultimately human attitudes toward bears that will determine whether bears will continue to exist in the state. Unfortunately, bears are viewed either as dangerous animals or cuddly pets. It is best to avoid these extreme views and instead show a healthy respect for this magnificent forest animal. By removing all attractants from your home and neighborhood, such as bird feeders, outdoor pet food, and unsecured trash, you are doing your part to ensure that bears and people can live together.
