The annual owners' meeting takes place at the pavilion at 9:00 AM, followed immediately by the annual Water Board meeting. We look forward to seeing old friends and welcoming new owners, with a brief recap of the previous year and the current plans for the continued improvement of our community. Later in the day, we will gather in the valley for kids games and a social. The spectacular fireworks display (presented by the Sherwood family) will take place around 9:00 PM. We sadly report that our community leader, Michael Richards, resigned from his position as President of the TBV HOA Board. He headed up the barn restoration project, steered us through the legal process for the 579 property, created a program to test the quality of our water in the lake, renewed and maintained the EAP (Emergency Action Plan; required for the North Carolina Dam Safety Plan), championed the efforts to improve our roads and remodel the dock, scheduled and oversaw no less than 5 board meetings each year, and fielded countless calls and emails from property owners who needed his help. Michael was an even-tempered leader, who considered and respected everyone's opinion. He will be greatly missed. We are grateful for his service to our community and appreciative that he continues to lend his insight and support to our board when asked.

#### **Roads Updates**

Recent heavy rains in the valley caused road damage and exposed water pipes. The roads have been graded, pipes covered up, and new gravel will be delivered

Road projects for the near future include: replacing guardrails on North Rhododendron, clearing out packed leaves from the ditches on South Rhododendron, clearing of rocks from Birch Trail and Azalea Trail, and track hoe work on Mallard Cove and the top of South Rhododendron.



# Lake Testing Updates

The lake was sampled on June 3<sup>rd</sup> per our contract with Earth Environmental Services. At the time of sampling, the lake results showed 3 CFU/100mL E.Coli present. These results are consistent with previous years and great news for our favorite swimming and fishing hole!

As a reference, the United States Environmental Protection Agency's (U.S. EPA) 2012 Recreational Water Quality Criteria (RWQC) of 126 CFU/100 mL of E. coli for primary contact should be the basis for any public health guidance and communications regarding recreating in surface waters.


